AN APPRECIATED CHESTNUT SPRINGS INSTITUTION

There's an obvious addition to all Chestnut Springs homes, every year, not long before Memorial Day. One day, each home has its standard arrangement of shrubs, mailbox and lawn, and the next, each home is adorned with an American flag, about the size of a small microwave oven.

Not divine intervention, these flags are distributed and planted next to each home's mailbox quite intentionally and determinedly. And it's been one Chestnut Springs neighbor's mission and pleasure to ensure so, for the past five years.

Carl Engelbert, along with his wife Kathy, has lived in Chestnut Springs for the past 35 years. "I started placing flags on Memorial Day five years ago when I was in real estate," Engelbert says. He adds, "I received several positive remarks from folks in the neighborhood and was encouraged to continue placing the flags."

This Ohio native came to a realization that the weeks prior to July 4th hold a certain integrity and deserve recognition, especially since he served during the Viet Nam war. "My wife Kathy and I discussed the real meaning of Memorial Day and we both felt it should be a holy day not just a holiday. So I continued placing flags and will do so as long as I can," said Engelbert.

So if you see him laying down these flags, during the early part of spring, tip your hat, say hello and shake the hand of the man responsible for helping us all remember that we're quite fortunate to live so well – and that there are those who have given their lives for us to do so.




OUR NEIGHBORHOOD NOTARIES!

The changes requiring ACC approval include any addition to the house exterior, exterior painting and roofing, fencing, outdoor hardscapes, and major landscaping project (over \$1000).

REMINDERS

The pool will open the afternoon of the last day of school, May 23.

A complete list of the rules can be found on our website, <u>www.chestnutsprings.org</u>. However, please review the following prior to using the pool.

- Pool hours are from 11 AM until 8 PM daily beginning May 24. Lifeguards will be on duty.
- Recreational members in good standing and approved guests only may use the pool. (Residents who are not members may not accompany a member as their guest.)
- Children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Non potty-trained children must wear swim diapers.
- No glass containers are allowed anywhere inside the pool fence.
- No chewing gum or tobacco are allowed.
- During the hourly break from swimming, everyone under 21 must exit the pool.
- No profanity, harassment, improper behavior, or intoxication.
- No rafts. Other flotation devices and pool toys may be limited in use by the Lifeguard.
- No tennis or golf balls.
- No pets.
- Please do not drag chairs on the pool deck. This damages the chairs and the pool decking.



BURNING BAN ARRIVES FOR METRO ATLANTA

Please be aware the metro wide ban on outdoor burning is in effect through Oct. 1. During these months, you may not burn leaves, tree limbs or other yard waste. Burning forest land or use air curtain destructors for land clearing is also prohibited. This is a state-issued ban that affects 54 Georgia counties. Cobb County Fire and Emergency Services staff is responsible for enforcing the burning ban in unincorporated Cobb County and the cities of Acworth, Kennesaw and Powder Springs.
