




OUR NEIGHBORHOOD NOTARIES!

The changes requiring ACC approval include any addition to the house exterior, exterior painting and roofing, fencing, outdoor hardscapes, and major landscaping project (over \$1000).

The approval process is described on the Chestnut Springs website at http://www.chestnutsprings.org/acc.p hp. In the middle of ACC page is a link to the request form. 


