We take turns taking our glass trash to a neighboring county recycling center. The more team members we get, the less frequently it's your turn to go!





REMINDERS

A complete list of the rules can be found on our website, www.chestnutsprings.org. However, please review the following prior to using the pool.

- Pool hours are from 11 AM until 8 PM daily beginning May 24. Lifeguards will be on duty.
- Recreational members in good standing and approved guests only may use the pool. (Residents who are not members may not accompany a member as their guest.)
- Children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Non potty-trained children must wear swim diapers.
- No glass containers are allowed anywhere inside the pool fence.
- No chewing gum or tobacco are allowed.
- During the hourly break from swimming, everyone under 21 must exit the pool.
- No profanity, harassment, improper behavior, or intoxication.
- No rafts. Other flotation devices and pool toys may be limited in use by the Lifeguard.
- No tennis or golf balls.
- No pets.
- Please do not drag chairs on the pool deck. This damages the chairs and the pool decking.



SPLOST PROJECTS UPDATE

Cobb County voters approved referendums on a Special Local Option Sales Tax for 2011 and 2016. From these SPLOST programs, Cobb PARKS will be using the funds for revitalization, facility renovations and upgrades to parks and facilities. Planning, coordinating and scheduling projects is ongoing, but you will see some of the work in progress or soon to begin. Here is a list of current projects:



PRICE PARK

Construction is underway for a new restroom building with attached pavilion and revised entry/exit. Installation of the masonry for the restroom building is complete. The roof truss installation and roof decking has been completed. The electrical and plumbing are being roughed in for the restroom building. The HVAC system is being installed. Gravel has been installed in the parking lot. The detention pond has been installed.

GREEN MEADOWS PRESERVE

Erosion control measures and the construction entrance has been installed at the new restroom building and associated parking lot near the community garden. Site grading has begun and the underground retention system is being installed. Investigation of the existing condition of the historic house was completed and the proposal submitted from the prequalified historic structures contractor. The contract award for construction was approved by the BOC and contracts were sent to the contractor for execution.

PRCA ADMINISTRATION COMPLEX

The structural steel is being erected on the new Administration Building. Exterior framing is underway and the electrical and plumbing rough in has begun. The new Shop Building is complete and is in use. Demolition of the existing Inventory Control building is complete. Construction of the Inventory Building has started.



MABRY PARK

The contractor has installed binder on the park entrance roadway. The construction of the boardwalk for the trail system is underway. The restroom/maintenance building slab has been poured and the parking area has been graded. The masonry work has started. The construction of the picnic pavilions has started. The header curbs have been poured for the parking lot. Electrical cable is being installed in the conduit along the park roadway. The water line loop system has been installed. The trails have been staked out.

MABLE HOUSE COMPLEX

Work on the list of approved interior improvements is complete. The design of the terraced seating on the grass slope behind the amphitheater fixed seating is complete and the project is being advertised for construction. Work is slated to begin in November following the performance season. The roof replacement at the stage and backstage areas of the amphitheater building and the cleaning and sealing of exterior walls has been completed.

OLD CLARKDALE PARK

The designer prepared a conceptual Master Plan based on public input and it was presented to the community in March. The designer has prepared a more definitive plan with pricing. A follow-up meeting was held with the community in May to discuss the options presented and the comments received at the meeting were reviewed. The proposed Master Plan was presented to the BOC at the June 26th meeting. You can view the Master Plan for Old Clarkdale Park here.

PARKS COMPREHENSIVE MASTER PLAN

The PARKS County-Wide Comprehensive Master Plan has been completed. The Recreation Board approved the plan in May. It was presented to the BOC at their June 25th work session meeting.

JIM MILLER PARK

The construction of the New Event Center is in progress. The structural steel has been erected and the contractor is nearing completion of the roofing insulation. Interior framing and masonry work is currently in progress. Sheetrock installation has begun. Plumbing, electrical, and HVAC installation is continuing. Installation of the pylon tower is underway.

New Marquee – Contracts for the new double-sided LED Electronic Message Center were executed and a preconstruction meeting was held.

New Ticket Booths –Construction of the main ticket booth has been completed and the CO obtained. The south ticket booth is nearing completion.

SYNTHETIC FIELDS – MUD CREEK SOCCER COMPLEX; HUBERT SOCCER COMPLEX; TERRELL MILL PARK

Synthetic turf installations have been completed and punch list items are being addressed. All fields are open and in use.

RUBBERIZED TRACK – MUD CREEK PARK; HURT ROAD PARK; SWEETWATER PARK

Installation of the synthetic surfacing for the walking track at Mud Creek Soccer Complex, Sweetwater Park and Hurt Road Park have been completed.
