# LOW BID FOR WALTON GYM AND PERFORMING ARTS REBUILD IS \$31.7 MILLION



The original Walton High School building has been torn down, and new gymnasium and performing arts space will go in its place.

According to an early look at next week's Cobb Board of Education meeting, a low-bid contract for \$31.7 million is being recommended for approval.

The school board will hold a work

session at 1 p.m. Thursday and a business meeting at 7 p.m., also on Thursday. Both meetings take place in the board chambers at the CCSD Central Office (514 Glover St., Marietta). Here's the full agenda packet for the meetings.

Before the evening session, a public budget forum will take place in the same place starting at 6:30 p.m. Citizens can comment on a proposed \$1.2 billion fiscal year 2019 budget. That figure has grown from an initial figure of \$1.059 billion in March.

Board members also are scheduled to tentatively approve that budget, and future public hearings will be held before formal adoption in May.

Walton students moved into a new \$48 million classroom building in August, and demolition of the original 42-year-old building has taken place over the winter.

The new 151,000-square-foot project will include main and auxiliary gymnasiums, a wrestling room, a weight room, locker rooms, a main theater, a black box theater and band, orchestra and choral suites.


Cobb-based Evergreen Construction is the low bidder, and its proposal comes in at nearly \$3 million less than the estimated cost of \$34.69 million. The funding is earmarked in the current Cobb Education Cobb SPLOST IV, and the projected completion date is November 2019.

(In January, Pope High School christened its new \$24 million gym and theater with a basketball doubleheader sweep.)

The new Walton project isn't the only major rebuilding contract on the school board's agenda Thursday. A rebuilding contract totaling \$47.4 million will be considered for Osborne High School, as will a new gym and theater project at Harrison High School for \$22.3 million.



#### COBB VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE FOR MOST 2018 ELECTIONS IS APRIL 24

The Cobb voter registration deadline for most of this year's local, state and federal elections is fast approaching. Georgia State Senate special election

The deadline to register to vote in most of those elections is April 24. Those elections include the May 22 primaries and any runoffs that will be held on July 24.



This is going to be a busy election season for East Cobb voters, with contested races for District 3 on the Cobb Board of

Commissioners, Post 6 on the Cobb Board of Education, several legislative seats and the 6th District Congressional seat.

In addition, statewide offices, including governor, as will as state and local judicial posts, will be on 2018 ballots.

You can register to vote, or check your registration status and precinct information, by visiting the Georgia Secretary of State's website.

The Cobb Board of Elections and Registration is also mailing out absentee ballots for those who'd rather vote that way. Voters don't have to give a reason when applying for an absentee ballot, but they should consider applying early to allow for mailing time.

Absentee ballots must be received at the Cobb elections office by 7 p.m. on May 22.

To request a ballot, visit the Cobb Elections website and get more information by calling 770-528-2581.

In addition to absentee ballots, advance voting will once again take place. That period will run from April 30-May 18, and will include a full week of advance voting May 14-18 at the East Cobb Government Service Center (4400 Lower Roswell Road).
